Lunch

- ➢ We allow students to choose seats at the beginning of the year but ask them to keep those seats unless they ask to move.
- 6th grade students eat lunch based on their teams during one of these two times
 - ≻Lunch 1 –10:00-10:30
 - ► Lunch 2 10:15-10:45
- Once you choose a seat- you must stay there unless you have permission to move
- Make good choices! Technology is NOT permitted during lunch (including laptops).

LOCKERS



Students will be assigned a lock and a locker.

- Students will be expected to keep the locker always LOCKED.
- Students should keep their possessions in their own locker.

Backpacks – Students must use a clear backpack if they're going to carry it between classes.

Afterschool Enrichment Program

- The After-School Enrichment Program (A.S.E.P.) provides fun after school activities for students.
- Classes are 6-week sessions typically in the Fall, Winter and Spring
- Classes will meet one day per week.
- Students who sign up for a class will be asked to pay a fee based on supplies and expenses.
- Class offerings are based on student interest and instructor availability.
- Classes include yoga, anime, Magic the Gathering, Book Club, art club, and more!

Students will be provided a district-issued laptop to use for schoolwork and homework.

Students will be responsible for bringing the computer to and from school and for keeping it charged each day.

A device agreement will be sent out to families prior to the end of this school year.

Teacher and staff will use Schoology as the main communication method for parents and families.

When at school, cell phones should be turned off and stored in locker.

Students are not permitted to use cell phones during the school day.

Taking photos/videos at school is prohibited

Depending on the severity of the cell phone offense consequences may range from a warning to confiscating the phone until a parent can pick it up.

Social Media In Middle School

- If your student has a device, they are on social media.
- Most of our complaints about harassment and bullying have a social media component.
- Students are more likely to threaten, use inappropriate language or escalate a situation from behind a screen.
- Issues that begin on social media but continue into the school day can have school-based consequences.
- Again, cell phones are not permitted to be on/used during the school day, so students should not be on social media during school hours.

Gifted Services

 Little Miami Local School District supports gifted students by incorporating challenging educational programs for identified students that vary in depth, breadth, complexity, pace or otherwise provide above grade-level content.

Gifted Language Arts Expectations

- Nightly homework varies dependent on what is finished in class that day.
- Every other week, students can expect an Article of the Week assignment that is given on Mondays and due on Fridays.
- Students are expected to read for 20-30 minutes a night
- 1-2 Book Talk projects per quarter

Gifted Math Expectations

- Students will have nightly homework in Math
- Students will have a weekly review sheet
- Students will complete projects throughout the quarter that challenging and enrich problemsolving skills.
- The class will move at a more accelerated pace and cover some 7th grade concepts.
