A High School Class Unlike Any Other

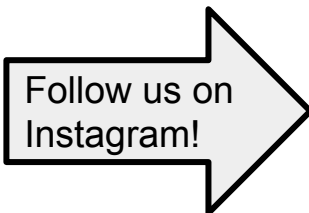
Air Force JROTC is an elective where you learn about citizenship and life skills emphasizing character development, leadership, and community service.
