#### 7<sup>TH</sup> GRADE REQUIRED ELECTIVES

All students are required to take Keyboarding & Gateway if **not** taking 2 year-long electives. (ex. band and choir)

<u>Gateway (STEM):</u> Students will imagine the world through the eyes of an engineer while exploring STEM ideas and careers. They will explore concepts such as 3D printing, robotics, programming, and design using cutting edge computer software. The class uses activity-oriented curriculum that applies STEM principals. (<u>S</u>cience, <u>T</u>echnology, <u>E</u>ngineering, and <u>M</u>athematics) to projects.

**Keyboarding Course Description:** This Keyboarding course is designed for middle school students to master the skill of entering alphabetic, numeric, and symbolic information on a keyboard and a ten-key pad using the touch method of key stroking. Emphasis is placed on development of accuracy and speed, proper techniques, and correct finger positions. Students will further develop and enhance touch skills for entering information using a keyboard to compose and produce personal, educational, and professional documents. Digital literacy, composition, and language skills are embedded throughout the course.

#### 8<sup>TH</sup> GRADE REQUIRED ELECTIVES

#### **Computer Applications Course Description:**

A semester long introductory course in personal computers using Microsoft Windows and Office Suite applications. The students will receive hands on experience in MS Windows, Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Office 365, OneDrive, Outlook, and other programs.

#### FOREIGN LANGUAGE-BIG CHANGES!!

- For the 2023-24 school year there will be 6 sections of Spanish and 3 sections of French.
- Foreign Language is only available for 8th grade students to take (rising 7th graders make sure to keep all criteria in mind as you complete your 7th grade year)
- To be eligible to take foreign language for High School Credit, you must have no D's or F's during your 7th grade year.
- Classes filled by GPA.
- Students with a 4.0 get priority.
- Which language should I take? Take time to read the foreign language flyer posted with the Google form in Schoology.

#### HONORS ENGLISH 7/8

- Course Description: Honors English focuses on the central themes of maturation, diversity, and the development of compassion, empathy, and respect for others. The curriculum teaches the skills of reading, writing, discussion, language use, and vocabulary development through the study of both literature and informational texts. Core readings include novels, plays, short stories, and poetry. Students will be asked to explore additional works of literature as well. The writing modes targeted are expository and fictional/personal narrative. Honors English serves as both an introduction to the high school English curriculum as well as an opportunity for students to critically explore their own maturation process through the lens of literature.
- The rigors of the course are intended to be commensurate with the preparation students need for success later in high school, in college, and in the working world. Students are being trained to be excellent critical thinkers, readers, textual analysts, writers, and creative producers of argument. The course will demand both high quantity and quality of effective writing for a range of audiences and purposes. By so writing, students will demonstrate their mastery of the conventions of the standard written language. Through the coursework, students will be expected to meet and exceed state standards for reading, writing, listening, speaking, and language.
